## 2. Our final events

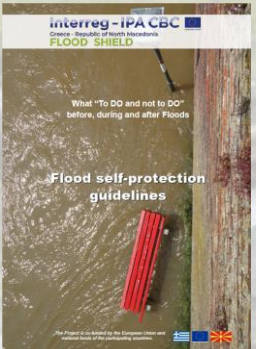
